Policy Summary: This policy identifies authorized names for ACAHM-accreditable programs.

Effective 1 January 2024, these are the only program names that ACAHM will recognize and accredit:

### 1. ENTRY-LEVEL PROGRAMS:

### A. Necessary for professional licensure and/or national certification in acupuncture

- Master of Acupuncture (MAc) or
  - Master of Science<sup>1</sup> in Acupuncture
- Doctor of Acupuncture (DAc)

## B. Necessary for professional licensure in acupuncture that includes <u>Chinese herbal medicine</u> and/or national certification in Chinese herbology/Oriental medicine

- Master of Acupuncture with a Chinese herbal medicine specialization (MAcCHM) or
  - Master of Science<sup>1</sup> in Acupuncture with a Chinese herbal medicine specialization
  - Master of [Science in] Acupuncture and Chinese Herbal Medicine<sup>2</sup>
  - Master of [Science in] Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine<sup>3</sup>
- Doctor of Acupuncture with a Chinese herbal medicine specialization (DAcCHM) or
  - Doctor of Acupuncture and Chinese Herbal Medicine<sup>2</sup>
  - o Doctor of Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine<sup>3</sup>

### 2. ADVANCED PRACTICE DOCTORAL PROGRAM:

Doctor of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (DAOM)<sup>4</sup>

#### 3. GRADUATE CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS:

- Certificate in Chinese Herbal Medicine (CCHM)
- Certificate in Asian Medical Bodywork (CAMB)

All entry-level programs addressing Chinese herbal medicine must meet the same ACAHM accreditation standards' requirements regardless of whether the name incorporates a "specialization" designation or not.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Programs may choose to not include the "Chinese" descriptor. All entry-level programs addressing Chinese herbal medicine must meet the same ACAHM accreditation standards' requirements regardless of whether the name incorporates a "Chinese" descriptor or not.
